What's Happening in Haiti?

It seems like so much is happening yet so little. Life in Haiti hasn't been in the "normal" realm for more than a year. For many months we experienced social and political upheaval as the nation demonstrated, rioted, and caused a nation-wide lockdown. Their frustration was with government corruption, broken promises of elected officials, and the devaluation of the Gourde.

In the midst of that, COVID-19 hit. At first Haiti didn't react much at all. Once it became apparent that the threat of death from the virus was real, the Haitian government responded by closing the border with the DR and restricting entry into the country via land, sea, and air. The airport closed overnight leaving many scrambling to find a way to get back to the US and other countries. The US state department got involved and began negotiating repatriation flights from Port to Florida. Initially there were a couple of flights a week but now it's several weeks between flights. We have prepared at the clinic as much as we can in a country with limited security and limited medical supplies. There are few COVID tests available, but we do have some to use if needed. We have readied the old cholera tent into a separate treatment area for COVID patients if needed. Now it is waiting game to see if and when COVID hits our area.



Schools missed most of the 2019-2020 school year. First they were closed for security reasons then they opened for a few short weeks before COVID hit and they were closed for the remainder of the year.

Here in the US we have all experienced radical life changes over this time of "sheltering in place". The biggest impact for the mission is a number of the Haiti benefit auctions were cancelled due to COVID. The HBA sales provide about 40% of our donations. The loss of those donations has caused us to use most of the money we had in savings. So far we have continued with almost all of our employees and programs but we need your help to keep serving the people of Haiti by offering medical care, education, and other things that IFM does. By doing this we are also providing jobs for more than 80 Haitians and with those jobs indirectly supporting many more than that.

We will continue helping our people as long as we possibly can. Would you consider giving to the Lord's work in Haiti and the DR to help make up for the shortfall from the cancelled actions?

part of this Dominican culture, and to have made many new friendships while living here. It has been a delight to walk alongside Kiko and Vicki, sharing in the joys and the struggles of church life. We trust the work of the Lord will continue in this community, as more souls are brought into the Kingdom. Jesus IS coming soon!
