Warm greetings from the children's home. We have experienced a lot of adjustments in our lives the past three months, but God has been faithful. Every week it feels more like home.

The biggest challenge we face here at the children's home is knowing how to deal with the emotional needs of the children. They are searching to belong, to find an identity. Some frequent questions they ask are, "Where are my mom and dad? Why don't they come see me? Do you think they forgot about me? Will I ever have a mom and dad for my very own?"

Everyday life here includes trying to keep everything running and improvising when you don't have or can't get parts. Lawn work and planting new things like pineapple and mango trees. Cleaning and doing laundry by hand when the washer doesn't work. Pretty much normal life. There's always things that need to be done and people on the porch that want something.

When life gets hectic and all we see is trash, dust, and poverty its easy to miss the beauty of God's handy work in the mountains that surround us.
